AT THE TABLE


All are welcome here!

KENTUCKY SERVANT EVENT

In January, nine students and volunteers embarked on a ten hour drive to Kentucky to serve and love the communities that had been affected by the tragic tornadoes that affected Mayfield, Kentucky and surrounding areas. We worked with an organization called Eight Days of Hope, a non-profit organization working hard to bring hope to the hopeless, especially in times of tragedy or destruction.

We joined hundreds of other individuals to serve the community in the Mayfield/Hardin area. Our team was placed to serve a family that lived in the country on the outskirts of Benton. During the tornado, this family lost a large portion of their roof which was then followed by rainfall that damaged the interior of their entire home. While they lost mostly everything inside their home, the frame still stood, which will allow them to rebuild.

Due to the water damage, the work we did was called "mucking out" the home, which is not common for tornado disasters (usually there is not enough left to muck out). This work involved removing everything from the house, furniture, fixtures, etc. Most items were completely damaged, but there were a handful of items and fixtures that were able to be salvaged. There was a lot to reflect on as we sorted through items that were still left behind, picking what was salvageable and not, and considering our own belongings and the difficulty of going through such a tragedy.

We also had some time to visit with the homeowner throughout the process, especially as we wrapped up the project. We were able to present him with a Bible, that we had written messages in, along with some gifts inside from the team at Eight Days of Hope. We also took some time to pray with him, for him and his family, as they rebuild and move forward.

One of the last tasks we were able to do during our time of service was to write Bible verses on the posts of the house. We loved the opportunity to be able to share the love and hope in God's Word with the homeowner and his family in this tangible way. We pray that these words were encouraging to their family and that they will find the hope and peace they have in Jesus in the midst of this storm they have been experiencing.

Thank you to those that served on this trip, and those that prayed for our team and supported us to get there! While we have the chance to impact the lives of others through trips like this, it is often the case that the lives of those who serve are equally as impacted. We look forward to our next opportunity to respond to the call to serve!
