A DAY IN THE LIFE AT FAIRMOUNT

A peek into how ministry has changed

The ministry at Wichita State University (WSU) began almost 60 years ago. From 1959 to today, there have been many passionate Christians who have grown and shaped the ministry into what it has become. The external façade and the name of the ministry have changed many times over the past five decades, but the mission has not.

Our mission was given to all Christians by our Lord, Christ Jesus in Matthew 28. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age".

Our vision for the ministry is to provide opportunities to foster relationships, encourage community, and promote dialogue about faith and life, for the university and the community in order to bring people closer to Jesus Christ.

Through Fairmount Coffee Co. God has provided a front door to meet new people. People who are unbelievers, unchurched, or just seeking a safe-place to live out their Christian faith.

In past years Pastoral Advisor, Dr. Tape, has said that often times he would see possibly a handful of people in a week's time, but now we see a handful of people before the business day even starts!

In its first year (August 2017-July 2018) Fairmount Coffee Company had 23,200 transactions. Think of the number of people who grace our doors who do not know the love of Christ, or who have possibly walked away from the Church entirely. And it is because of coffee that we are able to reach these new people!

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

In the past, international students have been a focus and priority of our ministry and this has not changed. The coffeehouse has brought many new relationships with international students who come to Fairmount Coffee to study. In fact, our entire staff has an extremely special relationship with a student from the Middle East who was raised Muslim. When we met him last fall, he was already a Christian, but he constantly seeks to know Jesus more and to learn more what Scripture says about his Savior. As a child and young adult in the Muslim faith, he was discouraged from asking questions, but we continually encourage him to come to us with any doubts and questions. You can often find him in our office, peppering us with his questions.

It has been special to see how seeking a simple cup of espresso has led him to be an active part of our ministry. He has volunteered in our first Vacation Bible School, he has come to our fellowship events and Bible studies, he has met with two of our local pastors for further in-depth instruction, and he is always willing to help serve the ministry at Fairmount in any way he can.

OPPORTUNITIES TO GATHER TOGETHER & SERVE

Fairmount Ministries offers many opportunities for young people to dive into the Word, connect with other believers, and grow in their faith. In the 2017-2018 academic year, **Fairmount**Ministries reached an average of 60 college students and young adults through Bible study! We are excited to continue those relationships this year as well as develop new relationships and invite more to join us in Bible studies and small groups.

This academic year, we have opportunities for young people to be in the Word weekly through small groups, to gather for topical discussions monthly with our local pastors (Theology on Tap), come together for a monthly Praise Night at Fairmount Coffee Co., and for young women to connect with fellow sisters twice a month over devotions and coffee (Saturday Sips).

Praise Night is something new that our students and young adults have asked for! It is a night where we come together in community--all are invited to attend. We start the evening in fellowship and a meal together. After dinner, we open with a few praise songs and hymns. Dr. Tape then leads an in-depth Bible study. After, we gather the prayer requests on our Prayer Wall (see pic. on next page) and break into small groups to pray over each other, the ministry, and those prayer requests left by Fairmount Coffee guests.

NUMBERS, BLESSINGS, & HIGHLIGHTS

Since 2017, our ministries have grown to offer 8 opportunities for Lutheran led <u>Bible studies a month.</u>

Small Group, weekly. Studying Romans with Luther.

Saturday Sips, twice monthly. **Theology on Tap,** monthly. **Praise Night,** monthly.

Last academic year, Fairmount Ministries reached an average of 60 college students and young adults through Bible study. **That is 15 times more than previous years!**

The space is being utilized more now than ever! There are four other weekly denominational & non-denominational Bible studies. These groups average a weekly attendance of 77 young adults/students.

Many Lutheran pastors and ministry staff, campus ministers, and other area pastors utilize Fairmount Coffee as a place to meet with, teach, and counsel people. It is truly special to witness God work through His faithful servants in our space!

In Summer 2018, Fairmount Coffee Co. hosted its **first Vacation Bible School** for the Fairmount Neighborhood. What a joy to see nearly 10 neighborhood children each evening! Thank you to King of Kings, Kansas City, Missouri & LCEF for making this week possible!

**** Some common misconceptions about our ministry is that we are sponsored/funded by one local congregation. Another is that we are fully funded by the Wichita congregations. And yet another is that the KS District fully funds our ministry. Although the KS District and many local congregations generously give to Fairmount, we are our own independent 501c3 and we are reliant on the generosity of donors, like you, to continue the ministry at Fairmount.****
